TORNADO IN KANSAS.

Many Small Buildings Wrecked and Hotel Unroofed.

Topeka, Kan., May 21. — News reached Topeka yesterday from Horton, Kan., of the visitation of a tornado at that point at midnight. The Union hotel was unroofed and a livery stable and blacksmith shop blown away. Several small buildings near, of little value, were also destroyed. One or two persons were injured, but it is not thought fatally.

DETECTIVE FOILED.

Cannot Secure Convincing Evidence on Reichlin Murder. Cleveland, May 21. — Detective Jacob

Mintz, who is working on the mysterious Reichlin murder case at Lorain, said yesterday: "I feel almost positive that I know the person who murdered Mrs. Reichlin. Unfortunately, however, the evidence is of such a nature that it might fail to convict." Mintz returns to Lorain to continue work on the case.

LIEUT. WALKER KILLED.

Cebu Fanatics Surround His Little Party, Killing Three.

Manila, May 21. — Lieut. Walker of the constabulary, who was reported missing after the recent fighting in the Island of Cebu, was killed by a superior force of fanatics who surrounded the lieutenant's party. Two privates of the constabulary were also killed and three were captured. Two of these prisoners were murdered. One of them escaped.

Rendered Homeless by Fire.

Chicago, May 21. — Twenty-five families were rendered homeless, nineteen buildings destroyed and nearly \$200,000 loss was caused by a fire that started in a garbage box last night at Seminary avenue and Dunning street.

Fight Ends Fatally.

Sonora, Mex., May 21. — As the result of an attack made on J. G. Webster, an attorney, Frank Price is dead with a bullet wound through his heart and J. M. Watkins has a bullet wound in his head.
