### NEWS IN BRIEF.

Overflow From the Wires in a Condensed Form.

Secretary Root has issued an order creating a military reservation at Malabang, Mindanao, consisting of 2,800 acres.

Buddy Ryan of Chicago and Charley Neary of Milwaukee fought a fast six-round draw before the Badger Athletic club at Milwaukee.

The Washington power building, adjoining the Lyceum theater at Buffalo, was destroyed by fire. The building was tenanted by a number of small manufacturing concerns. The loss is \$150,000.

Elias Williams, a negro employed by Alonzo White, a well-to-do farmer near Swarthmore, Pa., shot and killed Percy White, aged twenty-three years, son of the farmer. The two young men had quarreled. Williams escaped. Judge R. A. D. Wilbanks of Mount Vernon, Ill., died suddenly in Washington of heart disease, aged fifty-three years. He was for thirty years clerk of the supreme court of Illinois. Judge Wilbanks had lived in Washington the past year.

It is announced from Tomsk, West Siberia, that a gold reef seven feet wide has been discovered in the forests bordering the River Barikule. The trial workings yielded six to fourteen pounds of pure gold for 400 poods (14,428 pounds) of material extracted.

### GEN. YOUNG IS CHIEF.

Corbin and Carter Will Be the Other General Staff Officers.

Washington, June 21. — Secretary Root issued an order assigning Gen. S. B. M. Young as chief of staff with Maj. Gen. Henry C. Corbin and Brig. Gen. William H. Carter as the other general staff officers. Brig. Gen. T. H. Bliss is to become president of the war college. The order will take effect Aug. 15.

### EMPLOYERS ORGANIZE.

Movement Has Its Stimulus From Chicago as a Center.

Racine, Wis., June 21. — Nearly all the business men of the city are or soon will be members of a Manufacturers' Protective association, an organization suggested by the protective associations in Chicago. The fact that such an organization has been created was announced yesterday, and its membership increased several hundred in a few hours.

### Fell Dead on Leaving Train.

Fergus Falls, Minn., June 21. — A young man named Charles Hites was brought in from the town of Amor to be committed to the insane hospital here, and was just entering the omnibus at the Northern Pacific station when he collapsed and fell dead. He was thirty-one years of age and was recently married.

### "Female Bluebeard" Guilty.

Berlin, June 21.—The trial of the so-called "female Bluebeard," Frau Przygodda, who poisoned four husbands and who was detected by the fifth putting arsenic in his coffee, was found guilty and sentenced to death.

### Heavy Fines Imposed.

New York, June 21.—Three men who pleaded guilty in a Jersey City court to harboring slot machines used for gambling purposes in their places of business have been fined \$2,000, \$1,150 and \$500, respectively.
