## SPITE WORK

**Sheriff Torkelson Says Proceedings Started to Remove Him Are Actuated By Malice.**

Sheriff Swan Torkelson, of Clearwater county, whose removal from office the Reform League at Bagley is trying to accomplish at present, announces that he is not worrying about the outcome of his present trouble. Mr. Torkelson says the proceedings against him are actuated purely by malice and personal spite and he does not believe the governor will be influenced by them. He also expresses the opinion that he will get a more fair hearing before any commission that the governor may appoint to investigate his record than it would be possible to receive from any of the Reform League people at Bagley and is of the opinion that they will be unable to "go through" with the action they have started.

## HEIRS WANTED

**Man Who Was County Charge and Died at Insane Asylum Had Money.**

The board of county commissioners have just petitioned the probate court to appoint an administrator for the estate of Harry Limborner, who died at the state hospital for the insane last June. Limborner was formerly a resident of this vicinity and homesteaded a quarter section of land in the town of Maple Ridge. He was taken suddenly ill and was taken to the county poor farm, where about \$100 was expended in his care before he developed a bad case of insanity and was taken to the asylum, where he died. Limborner has relatives in the vicinity of Park Rapids, or in Hubbard county, whom the probate court is trying to locate. His homestead right is valued at about \$1,000.

## GET OFF EASY

**Small Boys Implicated in Burglaries For the Most Part Get Away Easy.**

The small boys arrested Monday afternoon for burglary committed at five different places in the city who were arraigned yesterday for the most part got off very easy. One will be sent to the state training school at the request of his parents, another will be sent to live with an uncle in the southern part of the state, where it is hoped he will be free from contaminating influence, and the other three are released under bond for their good behavior. All the boys were very thoroughly frightened but in view of the fact that they were not old enough in most cases to realize the gravity of their offense it was decided to give them another trial at being good.

## NEW SURVEY

**Extension of M. & I. From Kelliher to Beaudette May Be Surveyed This Winter.**

The announcement is made that the Minnesota and International railway will make a survey some time during the present winter of a proposed extension of the line from Kelliher north to Beaudette. The survey will be made to establish the practicability of the line and the probable cost of its construction to the promoters. It is announced that a party of M. & I. officials are to go over the country through which the line is proposed some time during the next week.
