LEASE MESABA MINE.

The biggest deal in iron property for several months past was consumated on Saturday, Corrigan, Mc Kinney & Co. buying the new big mine near Mesaba developed early in the year by G. W. Wallace, D. H Moon, Senator Hawkins and Jas. G. Vivian. The deal was known to be under consideration for several days, but the purchase price which must aggregate several hundred thousand dollars, is not made pub lic as yet.

The property is known as one of the most extensive deposits of the Mesaba, the character of the ore resembling the Vermilion deposits.

It will be recalled that the Minnesota Iron Co. has had two options on the property in question. The first was taken early last spring a bout the time the discovery of ore upon the land was announced. The consideration mentioned in the option at that time was \$500,000. The company allowed this option to lapse, and subsequently took another on a basis of \$480,000. This, too, was allowed to expire. last option ran out about five weeks ago. It is understood that the firm of Corrigan, McKinney & Co. has obtained the property on a basis somewhat less than the conacres in the property.
