A very pretty wedding took place at the residence of Mr. C. J. Philstrom on Wednesday evening this week. The contracting parties were Miss Dorothea Carolina Zerold and Mr. Lewis Westman, both of this city. The ceremony was performed by Rev. A. Tornell. Miss Augusta Johnson was the bridesmaid and Charles A. Johnson was attendant to the groom. A number of guests were present, and the happy couple were the recipients of a large number of handsome presents.
The bride is the daughter of Mr. A. P. Zerold, and has grown up from childhood in this city. The groom is also well known, having for years been employed as salesman in the store of G. C. Winchester. The newly married couple have the best wishes of numerous friends for their future success and happiness.

Sudden death of Horace W. Brown, of Argyle.

The people of this county were shocked to learn of the sudden death of Horace W. Brown, of Argyle, on Sunday afternoon at about 3 o'clock. The cause of death was peritonitis resulting from rupture of the gall bladder. For some time, in fact ever since his sickness last spring, he had not been feeling very well. Last week he attended the term of district court in Warren, working hard at his many cases, and when he returned to Argyle on Thursday morning he looked as well and hearty as ever. A fatal disease was however, gnawing at his vitals, and on the evening of the next day he was taken ill. It became apparent to the physicians that it was necessary to perform an operation to save his life. Dr. Wattam, of Warren and Dr. Wheeler, of Grand Forks were to perform the operation on Sunday afternoon, but Mr. Brown had breathed his last before they ever came near to operate upon him.
Horace W. Brown was born at Goshen, New Hampshire, on the 28th day of November 1850, and hence was at his death 44 years old, lacking a few days. At the age of five years he came with his parents to Minnesota. His father was the eminent jurist, the late Judge Brown, of Willmar. Mr. Brown was admitted to the bar in 1875, from which time he has been actively engaged in the practice of law. He had fine abilities as a lawyer and his services were often in demand in important cases. He has lived in Marshall county since 1881. For three years he held the office of county attorney, and at the last election he was elected again for the same office. Mr. Brown had also some experience as a newspaper man. Years ago he had established a paper at Sankopee, and in 1871 he with his father, established the Willmar Republican. He also published the Argyle Banner for several years. The death of Mr. Brown at a time when his prospects for a happy future were so bright is to be regretted. The funeral occurred on Tuesday afternoon under the auspices of the Masons, of which order deceased was a member. Rev. J. M. Brown, of Warren preached the funeral discourse. The Warren Masonic lodge and the Knights of Honor lodge were present at the funeral also the Marshall County Bar Association in a body. The brother of deceased, Judge C. L. Brown, of the 16th Judicial district also his aged mother and a sister, and some other relatives came to pay the last tribute to the one they loved. Peace be to his memory!


