### Commissioners' Proceedings.

Special meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, held at the Court House in Warren, Minn., July 8, 9, 10, 11 and 19, 1901.

July 8, nine o'clock a. m.

Meeting called to order by W. E. Wood, chairman.

All members present.

On motion resolved that bids be received until 4 o'clock p. m., July 8, 1901, for the construction of an iron bridge on Snake river in town of Vega, on the section line between section 6, town 154, range 49, and section 31 in town 155, range 49. The right reserved to reject any or all bids. Resolution carried.

Application of McLaughlin Bros. for correction of assessment and abatement of taxes recommended to the State auditor.

Petition of Albert Arntz and others to have the name of the town of Moylan changed to Little River, rejected.

Sheriff's report of prisoners boarded during the month of July, accepted.

On motion resolved that the old county jail, located on Lot 2 in Block 13, be rented to the City of Warren, for \$5.00 per month, rent payable monthly in advance. Resolution carried.

On motion resolved that the following rooms in the old court house be rented from July 1st, 1901, with privilege of sale, to Wm. Newman, to-wit: Sheriff, Probate Judge, Treasurer and Auditor's rooms, for a rental of \$6.00 per month, rent payable monthly in advance. Resolution carried.

On motion the report of the Board of Auditors was accepted, and ordered published with the proceedings of the Board of Commissioners.

### REPORT OF BOARD OF AUDITORS.

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, Marshall county, Minnesota.

GENTLEMEN:— We, the undersigned Board of Audit of said Marshall county, convened at the office of the county treasurer of said county, on the eighth day of July, A. D. 1901, for the purpose of examining and auditing the accounts, books and vouchers of E. Dagoberg, county treasurer of said county, and to count and ascertain the kind, description and amount of funds in the treasury and belonging thereto.

The following bids were received for building a bridge on Snake River in the town of Vega.

Dibley & Robinson \$1500.00 with wood joist, \$1650.00 with steel joist.

American Bridge Co. \$1300.00

L. H. Johnson 1396.00

William S. Hewett & Co. 1285.00

On motion resolved that the bid of William S. Hewett & Co. for \$1285.00 be accepted, and that said William S. Hewett & Co., be required to enter into a contract to complete said Bridge according to plans and specifications on file, also that they give a good and sufficient Bond in the sum of \$1500.00 for the faithful performance of contract. Resolution carried.

The following contract was then made with W. S. Hewett & Co., in accordance with their bid.

### CONTRACT.

THIS AGREEMENT, made the 8th day of July, A. D. 1901, by and between William S. Hewett & Co., of Minneapolis, Minn., of the first part, and County of Marshall, (by the Board of County Commissioners, of Marshall County, State of Minnesota) of the second part, WITNESSETH:

That the said first party hereby agrees to furnish all material, and to construct and complete ready for travel, the substructure and superstructure for a steel bridge over the Snake river, on section line between sections 31 and 6 at the site of the old bridge on said line, in town of Vega, in said county and state.

Said bridge is to be 50 feet long, extreme length, to be built in one span.

Said bridge to have one roadway 16 feet in width, and to be constructed in accordance with annexed specification and plan which are hereto annexed and made a part of this contract.

& The said first party hereby agrees to have the sub-structure ready for the erection of, and at right angles to the line of said superstructure on or before the 20th day of September, A. D. 1901, and said first party agrees to have the superstructure completed on or before the 20th day of September, A. D. 1901, condition of stream permitting, and contingent upon strikes, or other delays, unavoidable or beyond his control.

In consideration of the foregoing, materials and work to be furnished and executed by said first party, said second party hereby agrees to pay said first party the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred and Eighty-five (\$1,285) dollars, in the manner following, to-wit:

Three hundred (\$300) dollars on the delivery of the finished iron work at the nearest R. R. Station to the bridge site, and the balance of the above amount on the completion of
