**NEWS FROM SCANDINAVIA**

Principal Events That Have Transpired in the Old Countries Within a Week or So.

**DENMARK.**

The breech block was blown out of a gun on board the cruiser Heimdal, and the concussion and the fire injured a young cadet very seriously. "Kong Christian stod ved højen Mast" (King Christian stood by lofty mast), the heroic national hymn of Denmark, will soon be accompanied by dancing in merry Copenhagen. It is a ballet dancer named Berthelsen that has conceived the bright idea of inventing a national dance to the national hymn, a dance which is said to be very jolly and very easy to learn. Mr. Berthelsen has found that the national hymn is heard far too seldom, and he has figured out that it would become more popular if used with a dance. Mr. Berthelsen has even gone through the formality of asking the King for "permission" to call the dance "King Christian's Dance." And thus it happens that Denmark is the first country in the world to have an official national dance.

**NORWAY.**

The mackerel catch is very large along the coasts of Norway this fall, and the price has dropped from ten to eight cents a pound for fancy stock. Knut Hamson, the author, supposed that he was born in 1850, but the church books of the parish of Lowe, Griddbrandsdalen, prove that he was born Aug. 4 1859, at Garmotredet. Mr. Barrett, an English revivalist, who formerly belonged to the Methodist church, but was disowned by that denomination on account of his extreme views and methods, is again causing a great stir in Norway. This time he has been operating in the country around Kristiansand. Many people have been aroused to a high pitch of fanaticism, and the church authorities have been called upon to check the work of Mr. Barrett. Bjorn Bjornson, a son of the poet, is posing as the leader of those who are struggling to perpetuate the ordinary Norwegian-Danish book language. But he is not a success, his methods being so harsh that even his friends are displeased with him. On the other hand the language reformers are making a headway that points to success in the course of the next quarter of a century. Halvdan Koht, the new professor of history at the university, made a great hit when he chose pure Norwegian for his inaugural address. He spoke about the separation of Norway from Denmark in 1814, and so ably did he handle his subject, and so much patriotic feeling did he put into the delivery that the audience forgot the language used, or rather, they fell in love with a language that could make such a powerful impression upon the heroes.

**SWEDEN.**

Fire started in 5,000 tons of coal at Lulea, and it took a large force of men to put it out. In 1908 there were 1,259,700 private properties in Sweden, having an aggregate value of \$1,374,540,340. The king and a number of other hunters killed 39 moose on a recent hunting trip which lasted several days. In some localities in southern Sweden the rainfall has been as much as twenty inches for the past three months. At Fagersta, a few miles north of Sundsvall, the largest sulfate factory in Scandinavia is in process of construction. In a limestone quarry within the city limits of Sala has been found a vein of ore containing zinc, lead, copper, and even silver. From Jan. 1 to Sept. 1, the number of persons emigrating from Sweden was 14,647, which breaks the record for many years past. The people of Siljansnas, a small parish in Dalarna, picked 120 tons of lingon berries in three weeks, and the sales exceeded \$8,000. Rainy weather has damaged the crops of Skane to the extent of \$1,500,000. Hundreds of farmers are ruined, and will lose their farms unless the government steps in and helps them out. Herman Hansson, a drug store clerk in Lund, was found dead in the water fountain on the university square. He was subject to fainting spells, and his death was supposed to be accidental. In Orkened Parish, Kristianstad there are at least two tenant farmers whose contracts stipulate that they shall be entitled to use the farms on which they live "as long as the sun rises in the east and sets in the west." The number of sheep has been decreasing almost without interruption in Sweden for more than fifty years, and it seems as if wool growing will soon be a lost art in that country. The most formidable competitor at the present day is Australia. A new extension of the harbor of Simrishamn has just been taken into use. About \$175,000 has been spent on the improvements since 1906. A part of the harbor was mined out of the solid rock. E. Wennerstrom, a laborer, was so intent on killing a viper on the railroad track at Salskog that he did not notice a coming train, and the man was run over and killed. The first aeroplane built in Sweden has just been completed and tested at Nyrop Father's shipyard in Karlskrona. It has made several short trips and proved a graceful flyer.

**COPHER NEWS NOTES**

Minnesota Events of the Week in Condensed Form.

Balaton. — Hurled suddenly over a 10-foot embankment and barely missing being crushed to death by his automobile, which turned turtle four miles north of this city.

Worthington.—In a thunderstorm a barn on the W. M. Evans farm near Round lake was struck by lightning and burned. A horse, forty head of sheep and several hogs perished.

Red Wing. — In a rear end collision between a cattle train and a work train near Eggleston, on the Milwaukee, nine cars were derailed and Michael McCaskey, foreman, was killed.

Northfield. — A daylight fire broke out in the Skinner cottage, one of the ladies' dormitories of Carlton, and before it could be gotten under control, the building was practically destroyed.

St. Cloud. — One entire block of frame structures in the town of Rice, 15 miles northwest of St. Cloud, burned to the ground. The loss is estimated at \$20,000, partly covered by insurance.

Thief River Falls.—Judge Page Morris of Duluth has returned to this city on a hunting trip east of this city. The chicken crop is pretty well thinned out in this section. The ducks and geese are beginning to appear.

Beaudette, Minn., Oct. 4.—Forest fires are raging west of here along the line of the Canadian Northern. The lumber yard at Cedar Spur burned and freight trains were sent out to pick up the people in the territory of the fire.

Duluth. — Raymond Arndt, of Thief River Falls, who has been working on a steam shovel on the Mesaba range, was killed by a train at Iron Junction. His head was severed by the wheels. Arndt was 27 years of age and unmarried.

Faribault. — A message was received here last week from Ruskin, Florida, announcing the death of Mr. and Mrs. C. F. Miller, having died within a few hours of each other. They were among the very first of the pioneers of this country.

Pipestone.—The highest price ever paid in Pipestone county for a single load of seed was when J. S. P. Michael, a farmer, marketed, a load of timothy at a local elevator and received a check for \$260.56. The former record was \$218.50, also paid for a load of timothy.

Pipestone.—Actual work of rebuilding the telephone exchange has been commenced and a crew of men is at work. Several carloads of poles, cables and a new switch board have been received. The company will expend over \$25,000 in the improvement of its exchange here.

Pipestone.—The state will establish an experimental station on the county poor farm near Pipestone. Professor Thomas Cooper of the Minnesota Agricultural Experimental station has decided upon the location and representatives of the state will take charge of the farm next March.

Pipestone.—The annual fair of the Pipestone County Agricultural society was largely attended and proved to be one of the most successful ever held in the county. Over 2,500 persons were on the grounds the closing afternoon. Superintendent A. D. Wilson and Professor Haecker addressed the farmers.

Winona.—The congregation of St. Michael's German Lutheran church of Fountain City, Sunday celebrated its golden jubilee. Lutherans from all sections of the state and from Winona were present to join in the celebration. Winona people went to the festivities in a specially chartered boat. Rev. Gruber of Blue Hill, Neb., the first pastor of the church, was in attendance.

St. Paul.—C. W. Ames, secretary of the commission for the erection of a monument to former Governor Johnson, who has recently returned from a European trip, where he saw Andrew O'Connor, the sculptor, received a letter from the artist recently, stating that plaster models and paintings of the proposed statue had been shipped. Immediately after their receipt by Mr. Ames a meeting of the commission will be held to study the sketches and accept or reject Mr. O'Connor as the artist to execute the statue.

St. Cloud. — Both his wrists raw and bruised from hammering with a stone the handcuffs that circled them, O. J. Oja, inmate of the state reformatory, who made a sensational escape near Maple Lake by jumping through the car window while the train was running at full speed, was captured near Moorhead and brought back to the institution by Assistant State Agent G. E. Knickerbocker. Oja was in hiding in the thick woods near Maple Lake and made his way to Moorhead before being captured by the officers. It is a mystery how he succeeded in getting the handcuffs off. It evidently was a hard and painful process.

Luverne.—James Gray, Minneapolis Democratic candidate for governor, and Fred W. Johnson, Democratic candidate for secretary of state, were speakers at the Rock county fair.

**Duluth Expects \$2,300.**

Duluth. — An unofficial report has reached Duluth from Washington that the population of this city will be announced as about \$2,300, which would be an increase of over 29,000 in ten years and 17,1400 during the last five years.
