Anders P. Lundstrom, born in Tsojo, Sweden, on Nov. 11, 1857, died at his home in Township of Lincoln, on Oct. 16th. For three years he has been a sufferer of Diabetes until six months ago, when the sickness turned into dropsy. A. P. Lundstrom was one of the first settlers in this township.
