Mr. Belford Vies With Sunset Cox as the Funny Man of the House.

An Unusually Magnificent State Dinner, for Gentlemen Only, Given by the President.

[Special Telegram to the Globe.] WASHINGTON, March 5.—Mr. S. C. Cox took the trouble this afternoon, while the house was discussing the naval appropriation bill, to give an explanation of his failure on three occasions to achieve the speakership.

INTERESTING INTERVIEW.

William Cook Tells How He Predicted Garfield's Assassination—Did Guitau Have Accomplices?

The Star Route Trial and the Influence that Secured Attorney General Brewster's Appointment.

[Special Telegram to the Globe.] WASHINGTON, March 5.—Mr. Wm. Cook, who was quoted by ex-Postmaster General James in his testimony before the Springer committee, was the first counsel employed by the government in the prosecution of the star route cases. Mr. James said that Mr. Cook notified President Garfield several days before the assassination that some dire calamity would befall him as the result of the contest between the stalwarts and half-breeds, together with the star route trials.

CRIME RECORD. A Number of Lesser Crimes From All Parts. CHICAGO, March 5.—The coroner's jury to-day concluded their investigation of the Winnetka murder. The verdict finds that Mr. and Mrs. Willson came to their deaths by violent means, at the hands of some person or persons unknown, but we, the jury, believe the evidence casts suspicion upon Neil McKeague. The verdict in no way alters the status of the case, two indictments for murder having been found against McKeague prior to the coroner's investigation. The state officials took no part in the coroner's hearing, being opposed to the divulgence of the string of evidence they claim to possess against McKeague, hence the mildness of the verdict.

CRIMINAL LIBEL. UNIONTOWN, Pa., March 5.—Suits of criminal libel have been entered against the editors of the Republic-Standards, by R. H. Acklin and Lawrence Krotts, members of the party who were indicted for the murder of a man named Thompson, murdered a boy named Thompson, and then poisoned himself.

ARRESTED FOR PERJURY. NEW YORK, March 5.—Arthur Dudley Vinton, law partner of Perry Belmont, was arraigned in the police court to-day on a charge of perjury, preferred by Erastus S. Ransom, former law partner of President Arthur. The arrest grew out of a long-standing litigation between the parties, over a check for \$100, given by Vinton to the complainant in payment of a loan, and which was refused when presented for payment.

TO BE HANGED. WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., March 5.—Theodore Hoffman, the murderer of the peddler, Marks, is resented to be hung on September 18.
