

REPUBLICANS AT WORK.

A Tolerably Lively County Convention Held Yesterday.

Wherein a Solid Sabin Delegation Was Sent to the State Convention.

Notwithstanding Driscoll Boldly Stylized Him an "Octopus."

Republican Primaries Last Night for the City Convention to-morrow.

The Bummers Capture the First Precinct of the First Ward Again.

The Republican delegates who were elected at the primary meetings held in St. Paul Friday evening, met in convention at Turner hall at 10:30 yesterday morning. The purpose of this convention was to send two delegates to the Republican state convention, which is to be held in St. Paul, Minn., on the 29th and 30th inst.

Called to Order.

The delegates that had gathered were called to order by Mr. Stanford Newell, who read the call and explained the object in view and the business the convention had before it.

Temporary Officers.

As soon as the body was called to order Mr. Ed. S. Bean made a motion that Hon. William Merriam be selected as temporary chairman, and W. A. Nichols as secretary, and the same was adopted.

Committee on Credentials.

Gen. M. D. Flower made a motion that the chairman appoint a committee of one from each ward and one from the country, on credentials. This motion was adopted and the chair appointed the following: First ward, John H. Hickman; Second, Geo. R. Morton; Third, R. C. Wiley; chairman; Fourth, Peter Thorwald; Fifth, H. Stockstrom; Sixth, M. S. Gray; country, Wm. Freeman.

A recess ordered.

On motion of Gen. M. D. Flower, the convention took a recess of ten minutes to give the committee on credentials time to consider and prepare its report. In a short time the committee reappeared from an ante room and the convention re-assembled.

Delegates announced.

The chairman of the committee immediately read the report of the committee on credentials. In doing so two delegates from the Second precinct of the Fourth ward, and it did not feel like taking the responsibility of deciding which delegation should be admitted and which refused. The committee therefore decided to report the fact to the convention and leave that body to determine which should be received. The chairman then read the following list of delegates:

A little picnic began.

This picnic was not a very large one, but it was as large as the convention could conveniently make it. It arose in this way. In the Second precinct of the Fourth ward the Flower party opened the polls at the regular hour and closed them at half-past six, when, according to the call, they should not have been closed before seven o'clock. Mr. Nash and his friends went to the polls about half-past six and found them closed. They opened them, appointed judges, a clerk, etc., and went through the regular motions till seven o'clock when they closed up and went to the convention with the delegates they had elected. These were the foundation facts that caused the picnic.

Gen. Sanborn, who by nature is eminently a man of peace, endeavored to pour oil on the troubled waters, and suggested that each side be allowed ten minutes to state his side of the case, so that the members of the convention could get at a complete understanding of the whole matter, and thus be enabled to vote with intelligence upon it. This proposition seemed to meet the approval of the convention and was formally agreed to.

At the suggestion of Mr. Nash Gen. Flower proceeded to state his side of the case, which was not different from the above recital, except in the minute. He said that there were two Republican tickets in the field in that precinct; that the polls were opened at five, and according to the call they should have been kept open till 7 o'clock, but that between the time they were opened and the time they were closed there were several conferences between the two sides and it was finally concluded, or an agreement was entered into which seemed to be in harmony with the principles of the Republican party and compromise. By this agreement two were to withdraw from each ticket and the breach should thus be closed up. With this everybody was satisfied, and as the voting was slow, and the thing appeared to be all satisfactory, and really ended they declared the polls closed. There was no intention to deprive any one of the privilege of voting, nor was there any attempt to do anything tricky and underhanded. It was a plain open agreement. The judges acquiesced and everything seemed all right. After everybody had gone home, some others went to the voting place and that is what has caused the trouble.

Mr. W. H. H. Johnson opened the matter on behalf of the other side. He opened in a cool and calm manner, but he is of a nervous temperament like Mr. Nash, and he could not hold it down and keep cool as Gen. Flower did. The boys are not equal to the old staggers and the case hardened politicians. Flower was cool, deliberate and calm. Johnson and Nash were hot and fiery. Mr. Johnson declared that General Flower had admitted his case all away. He had no defense. The fact was the polls were closed

before they were allowed to be. That rendered the Flower delegation illegal from the start. The others, the Nash delegation, were the only legal delegates there were elected. Mr. Johnson did not know anything about any compromise, nor did he care anything about one. He had agreed to no compromise and was accordingly not bound to observe the terms of one that he knew nothing about. The fact is the polls were opened at five and closed at half past six. There was a right under the call to vote till 7 o'clock, and that is what was done. We had nothing to do with a compromise. We were then and are now before the convention fighting for principle, a matter of right. Mr. Johnson declared with considerable excitement and emotion that he stood there for right and principle, the right to vote. On this point he grew quite eloquent. He declared that there were no polls. There was no ballot box. We, the people of the precinct, he declared had a right to appoint judges, clerks, etc., and vote. The people did so on that occasion, and they alone he declared, were the proper ones to be represented in the convention. This thing of defeating the ballot box is done all over the United States, and there is where power and wrong defeat principle. He wanted to know of the people had any rights. It was a matter of principle, he declared, and he declared he was not in politics, and only appeared there as a citizen to maintain his rights.

General Flower, in reply declared he wanted nothing but right, and asserted that if the polls had been kept open it would have made no difference. Any talk about depriving any one of rights was all a mistake; there was no such attempt. Had the polls been kept open till 7 o'clock the result would have been just the same.

Mr. Johnson replied that what was still worse, was the fact, as he had been informed, that the 150 votes said to have been deposited before 6:30 had not been counted, and were not counted at all. It was not satisfactory nor fair to cut people off and not allow them to vote.

Mr. W. B. Dean, who was on the Flower side of the controversy and one of the delegates admitted that the polls were closed before they ought to have been. Still he did not think that those who had gone there and voted ought to be deprived of their rights because the judges had failed to do their duty, and closed the polls before they ought to have.

Mr. Nash declared that the Flower party did not count the ballots at all. They closed up the polls just when they pleased and threw the votes away, but after they found out that there was to be trouble they went and hunted up the ballots, but they did not find them all and really grieved at the whole matter. The whole proceedings were wrong. It was generally the case that people go to their supper and then go over to the polls getting there about half past six, and vote and go home. This is what he was intending to do. He drove up to the voting place in his buggy and wanted to vote but could not as the polls were closed, and it was only half past six. There were a number of other citizens there also who declared they had voted, and such a commotion was made that they were not allowed to vote. They accordingly opened the polls and kept them open until it was time to close them at 7 o'clock. During that time there were sixty-two votes cast and every one of them was legal, while there was not a legal vote on the other side for the simple reason that the closing of the polls and taking out the ballots was an illegal act.

F. G. Ingersoll made a motion that the Flower ticket be recognized and the delegates allowed to vote.

Mr. E. S. Bean made a motion that both delegations be admitted, and that the whole convention be dissolved.

A vote was taken on Mr. Bean's amendment which was lost. At last they got a legal vote on the other side for the simple reason that the closing of the polls and taking out the ballots was an illegal act.

It was determined that where the delegation was not full that it should vote the full vote.

Delegates to the district convention.

On motion of Mr. Lightner the chair appointed a committee consisting of one from each ward and one from the country to report a list of 15 delegates to the district convention: First ward, Geo. R. Finch; Second, H. B. Willis; Third, W. H. Lightner; Fourth, E. S. Bean; Fifth, Henry Schurmer; Sixth, M. J. Bell; from the country, H. J. Brainerd.

Another recess.

As soon as these two committees were appointed, the convention took a recess for an hour or more to give the committees an opportunity to consider the matters before them. The worst struggle was in the committee to select delegates to the state convention. In this committee the majority was with the Flower party, and it was the whole convention, while F. Driscoll was bitterly opposed to him, and tried very hard to put C. K. Davis at the head of the delegation, and it is well understood that the committee was willing to give Mr. Davis a place provided Mr. Driscoll would agree to support a resolution favorable to Sabin. Mr. Driscoll declined to accept any conditions whatever and this was the reason why Mr. Davis' name was left off. The friends of Mr. Davis in the convention were quite opposed in regard to the fact that Mr. Davis had been forced into such a position.
