

METHODIST ANNIVERSARIES.

Commemorative of the Series of Three Days' Meetings with Two Sessions Yesterday.

Sermons To-day by Drs. Vincent, Miller, Freeman and George—Sunday School Union Anniversary This Afternoon at the Grand Opera House.

The first of the series of these meetings was held in Jackson street church yesterday at 3 p. m. Dr. Marshall presided. Prayer was offered by Rev. R. Forbes, of Minneapolis. Rev. T. J. Wagner, of Minneapolis, delivered a short address on Sunday school libraries. Dr. J. H. Vincent, of New York, spoke at some length on the ideal Sunday school. Sunday schools should not be so much given to intellectual as to spiritual work. Dr. Vincent suggested a reform in Sunday schools by separating the younger from the older scholars. His experience had taught him that much better results were thus obtained.

The attendance at this meeting was very good for a week day service.

Evening services. In the evening Dr. Vincent presided, and Dr. Miller, of Philadelphia, opened with prayer. After the usual preliminary exercises, Dr. H. E. George, of Chicago, spoke of the difficulties of tract distribution. The first difficulty was that of the composition of the tract itself. It was necessary to have the contents attractive and interesting, and a good deal of skill was necessary to meet this requirement. Then again there was a natural prejudice against tracts and against those who distribute them. He suggested various changes, one of which was the idea of printing a calendar. It was thought that this might add interest to the tract and render it more attractive and acceptable.

Dr. Freeman, assistant secretary of the Tract society, followed in an address treating of the silent forces as represented by the Sunday School Union Tract society, in reforming and instructing the world. He then answered and explained some of the difficulties suggested by Dr. George, referred to above.

The meeting was quite an interesting one and was finally closed with a benediction.

In this connection it may be mentioned that Dr. Vincent will lecture on Monday or Tuesday night, in the First Baptist church, on Chautauque idea. The lecture will be free, and a definite announcement will be made to-day or Monday.
