It has done a large amount of damage, and on the upper waters has been washed from the meadows, and the supply will be short. At the bridge of the Central Wisconsin railway the timber and lumber for the temporary structure have been washed away, and the work will be much delayed. The best pier is only just out of water, and the current is strong at every point under the bridge. It is expected that work will have to stop for a few days until the water recedes somewhat.
