ANOTHER ELECTRICAL HARNES. The Telegraph to be made to Print the Messages at Transmits at the Rate of 6,000 Words Per Minute. [Reviewing Journal.]

A gentleman in this city promises a revolution in telegraphy, so far as the transmission of messages, but more especially Associated Press dispatches, is concerned. He is now at work upon a device which, if successful, will receive and print telegrams on slips of paper, just as they appear in the newspaper after being placed in type by the printer. The chief benefit of this arrangement will not consist merely in the advantages which printed matter possesses over written, but in the increased rapidity with which the reports can be transmitted. At present fifty words per minute is considered an average rate, but this new invention promises to print it out by electricity as it is flashed from the wire at the astonishing speed of 600 words per minute. The gentleman who is at work upon this marvelous invention has found it necessary to order intricate machinery, which is now being manufactured by a well known eastern firm. He does not expect to complete his machine before late in the winter, as he has professional duties which occupy a portion of his time; but from what he has already accomplished he is confident of success.

MINNEAPOLIS MILLS. Flour Fairly Steady—Wheat Lower but Firm—The Weekly Review.

The Northwestern Miller supplies the Globe with the following weekly review of the flour and grain market prepared for its issue of to-day:

The mills of Minneapolis have gotten down to work again, and are humming along without stoppages. The stage of water in the river, under the influence of very mild weather, commenced to rise on Friday of last week, and by Saturday morning it was comparatively high, enabling all the mills that cared to run at good capacities. The river has also been free of anchor ice, lifting a weighty burden from the shoulders of the operative millers. The flour production of last week, as anticipated, was very light comparatively, falling below 100,000 barrels. Official figures show it to be less than 94,710 barrels—an average of 15,785 barrels per day—against 136,740 barrels the preceding week. This is the highest output since the mills got fully under way on this crop. For the current week the mills have a good stage of water to work on, and have started in with the evident intention of turning out a very large amount of flour. There are, however, two mills out of the twenty-three in the city that are idle; but those running are being crowded, to make up for lost time, as snow is falling so fast for the week well to toward 140,000 barrels. As the weather prevailing now is warm and mild, millers are apprehensive lest they be again seriously troubled with another ice when cold weather comes on.
