The instruments for a volunteer signal service station were placed in position yesterday in the high school building by Prof. McGinnis of the signal service, United States army, stationed at Northfield.

The station is furnished with instruments by the city council and board of education, and the instruments will prove valuable additions to the high school philosophical apparatus.

The Jamestown branch of the Northern Pacific will have the rails laid to Minnewaukon, on Devil's Lake, this week, and will very soon be opened for regular business.

A good deal of sorghum cane is being produced in Huron county, and a party has procured a mill for making syrup. This is a new thing in Dakota and an experiment.

The plans have been completed for a new hotel at Milbank to cost \$12,000, new buildings for a creamery are assured, and Maj. Evans, the new editor of the News, is quite a boom.

Clarence Huggins of Dickinson while returning from the Black Hills the past week, discovered four buffaloes near the headwaters of the Little Missouri and killed one. It is very rare to see one anywhere in Dakota.

The people of Brookings endorsed the course of their member of the council at Bismark, H. H. Natwick, who has been severely criticised, by electing him mayor almost unanimously. The town cast 192 votes, which is much less than the full vote.

Nearly all the denominations have attempted to organize a church at Willmot, the largest town of Roberts county, and the rival town of Traverse now offers to send missionaries. They were the headquarters of the opposing forces in the county seat war.
