The Republican Convention at Huron Passes a Few Resolutions and Adjourns.

It Indorses the Sioux Falls Constitution Throughout and Plans for Admittance.

Huron, Dak., Oct. 22.—It was nearly 9 o'clock this morning before the Republican convention at Huron adjourned. The nominating candidates for supreme judges, Capt. Lucas of Chamberlain sprang upon a chair and amid the wildest enthusiasm and cheering began singing "Marching Through Georgia." The entire crowd joined in the singing, and for ten minutes there was a general hurrah. The report of the committee on resolutions was unanimously adopted, and also complimentary to Chairman Sandborn, the citizens of Huron. After adjournment the delegates returned here on the Sixth judicial district, got together and selected executive committees and judges as follows:

First—G. Smith, judge, and W. S. Bowen of Yankton committee-men.

Second—H. H. Keitt of Sioux Falls, judge; W. Wait of Lincoln, committee-man; J. A. Owen of Kingsbury, committee-man.

Fourth—H. Dillon, judge; H. S. Preston of Spearman, committee-man.

Fifth—Seward Smith, judge; W. C. Allen, committee-man.

Most of the delegates returned here this afternoon, all being well pleased and fully satisfied with the result of the convention. Following is the preamble and resolutions adopted:
