A CONCEALED AFRICAN.

Close Scrutiny of the Dawes Sioux Reservation Bill Reveals Some Unpleasant Facts.

WASHINGTON, May 28.—The friends of the Dawes bill are nervous and active. Its enemies are developing all of their strength and making a bitter fight upon it.

The cause of all the opposition to the measure is financial and political. I have tried to get satisfactory opinions expressed by McManima and McClure, for publication, concerning the status of the bill but they are reticent. They will say nothing except what is in favor of their measure.

What objections there may be to it they either do not know, or will not acknowledge that they do not know. They are of a color of nose, and they seem as jubilant and content as though the battle had been fought and the victory won. But a careful canvass of the members of the house reveals the fact that there is much dissatisfaction with the clauses of the bill which grant everything to the Chicago & Northwestern, and the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul roads.

You see, those corporations seem to want the earth and also a section of the moon. There's the rub. The bill as now framed is to that road 640 acres opposite Chamberlain and also opposite Pierre. Here are possible town sites, and of a sufficient bigness to enable the companies to sell lots enough to build several railroads.

It also grants a right of way across the domain from the Missouri river to the Hills, touching Lawrence, Pennington or Custer counties. However, it gives them town sites every ten miles of the route. Fortunately for the public treasury these corporations are modest enough not to ask for good fences all along the line. They do not ask the government to furnish the rolling stock and pay the engineers and other employees; but they ask everything else. Do you blame an honest congressman for doing a little "kicking" in the name of the people?

The friends of the measure are willing to permit wrong, in a certain degree, in order that good may come of it. They are vitally interested in the success of the bill, and for their financial life depends upon it. They see the error, possibly, of granting so much to the corporations, but they do not fight it, because they do not want to fight anything. They are so anxious for the passage of the bill that they do not want to antagonize any of their friends.

They are not at all in favor of the principle of giving away everything to corporations for nothing is wrong. You must understand that

AND THE RAILROADS PROMISE NOTHING, and are bound to promise in return for the privileges conferred upon them. They do not have to build roads across the reservation within any specified time. They are not required to do anything except that they shall have the right to build roads within six months after the passage of this act." By the phrase "right of purchase" is meant the payment of a nominal sum for the lands which are granted, in accordance with the provisions of the act.

The arrival of Hon. M. H. Day on Monday last was timely and well for this measure. Immediately upon his arrival he was called upon to go to support the bill. He was called upon in his room by Mr. McManima and his aid solicited. The Globe man was there, ahead of the Dakota journalist, and he heard Mr. Day's speech.

I know that the gentleman's actions during the past week, have thoroughly accorded with his words.

THE CURSE OF SLAY MIXES are the curse of Dakota. It makes a friend of the territory tired and heart sick to witness the jangles and jars which constantly arise. Now it happens that while Mr. McClure is in the territory, he is in favor of the opening of the reservation, he is not in favor of the railroad monopolists. Strange, that a congressman should be honest, but Mr. Wellborn is not, and that is the matter. He is like Senator Dawes and others, opposed to giving the whole hog to the railroads and leaving only the skeleton to the settlers.

He has been led to believe that Mayor McClure is here in the interest of the Chicago & Northwestern railroad, instead of in the interest of the city of Pierre. He says that McClure has not said a word against the provisions of the bill granting the right of way, 200 feet, across the reservation, without specifying that they shall build a road within any restriction of time; and that he has not raised his voice against the provision which grants to the Milwaukee & St. Paul road 640 acres of land on the west side of the river, where they can build up a new town to rival and destroy Pierre. He says that Mr. McClure has not said a word against the railroad 100 acres every ten miles for a town site. When I saw that gentleman, I have never opposed the railroads, nor anything else. I have not said here here to antagonize anything. I am trying to progress for my people, and have allowed opposition and content to be made by those who do not care for the people but for the provisions referred to in the bill, and I have not taken it upon myself to do so. McClure is not afraid of the railroads, but he is not afraid of the capitalists and corporations in the country, if necessary, for the opening of the Sioux reservation; but I am not seeking any fight. That is not my business.

FIGHTERS ALWAYS MAKE ENEMIES. My mission here is to make my friends for the bill, and to secure its passage if possible. It is a matter pro bono publico. There is neither time nor cause for inviting opposition. If my people express themselves as opposed to the measure referred to, I shall offer them and become an opponent. For the present I am inclined to trust to the honesty, sincerity and ability of my friends, Wellborn, Nelson and Dawes. They are inclined to do the right thing, and I believe that our people will be satisfied, or at any rate contented with the bill when it finally passes. We cannot get the entire act, but must be contented with our share. We cannot have our cake and eat it, too.

I am informed by a friend in the senate that the bill has not been prepared and favorably reported upon by the committee, the clause giving the big slice of territory to the railroads, was inserted by the persuasive eloquence and persistency of Senator Spooner, of Wisconsin, who is alleged to be especially friendly to the Milwaukee road. That, however, is a matter of private senatorial history for which I

CANNOT VOUCH, but my informant is on the inside and usually gives reliable information. If that is the case, and if the railroads are expected merely to gobble up as much land as they can get, they are not to be trusted. It is better that they should give up binding themselves to build within any specified time, there is a "nigger in the woodpile" and he ought to be disclosed. If the railroads are to be given away without any solicitation on the part of the railroads, there is something wrong, radically so. Under the circumstances, it behooves Representative Nelson and Senator Spooner to be very cautious before they go ahead any further in the matter. The Sioux reservation ought to be opened and speedily too, but it ought not to be given away to the railroads at the expense of the settler and the Indian. There is not so much public domain to be thrown open to settlement that the government must needs find some one who will do the better part of the legislation to corporations. It would be well to inquire into the causes which induce members of congress to make such grants, from time to time, unsolicited. It would be well for Representative Nelson's constituents to ask him why this is this.
