

VALUES PICKING UP.

A Slight But Perfectly Natural Improvement in the Wheat Market at Chicago.

The Temper of the Local Crowd Shown Very Clearly to be Decidedly Bullish.

Some Strength in Both Corn and Provisions and an Advance Recorded.

Nothing Doing in Wall Street but Liquidation, Which Causes a General Decline.

CHICAGO, June 12.—Conditions on 'change were improved today. There was no longer anything approximating it, but values picked up in a steady manner that was encouraging to the bulls, and carried with it the conviction that a small purchase of wheat at the bottom of the market could be bought, would be a good thing to effect. But the advance was by no means as sharp as yesterday's decline was. Still, being an advance, it seemed to have an enervating influence and plainly showed the temper of the local crowd. First-comers around the board were without news of any kind, and opened July at 74 1/2c, substantially the same as closed the evening before. Without much attempt to stop it, July fell off to 73 1/2c on some free selling by Fray and Carter, but it was caught by a buyer, and recovered prices to the opening price, 74 1/2c. By this time (11 o'clock) quite a number had been bought, and the market, generally, and subsequent speculation was of such a kind as to keep up this tone. At times, Dwyer and Gullette, Schwartz, Dupre, and others were letting go considerably, but there was fully as good buying by Stevens, McFarlane, and that class of operators. The close at 1 o'clock was steady and about firm at substantially opening quotations. More strength contributed to the market, and about 300,000 1/2c and ruled firm. Provisions attracted very little attention, except at times, when there were spurts of strength, which were picked up with a good deal of suddenness. A net advance of over 1 1/2c was made in pork and quite well sustained.

Amend section 21 by adding thereto the following: "It shall be the duty of the Committee on Finance to examine and report the accuracy of all demands against the Board, and all accounts shall be audited by this committee at least by the chairman, and no bill shall pass the Board unless so audited."

COMMITTEE ON SCHOOLS. The first paragraph of section 30, amended so as to read as follows: "The Board of Public Works, Sec. 30. It shall be the duty of the Committee on Schools to appoint all teachers and assistant teachers, and to fill all vacancies, except as heretofore mentioned, by the Superintendent of Schools, and shall report the same to the Board for confirmation at the first regular meeting thereafter, and no teacher shall be appointed or retained in the Board, except to fill a temporary vacancy. They shall report their annual list of appointments at the first regular meeting in July, or at a special meeting called for that purpose. If they fail to confirm their appointments, the committee shall make other satisfactory to the Board."
