The czar says Russia will recognize the Bulgarian regency and assist the union of Bulgaria and Eastern Rumania, on condition that no acts of violence be committed by the regency.

English Fishing Vessels Seized.

HAVRE, Sept. 13.—Eleven English fishing boats have been arrested by the authorities for infringing the law, which forbids foreign fishing vessels to enter the French ports, except when compelled to do so by stress of weather or other necessities. It is ascertained that the arrests partake of the nature of reprisals for arrests of French fishermen on English waters.
