County Returning Boards of the State Revising the Work of the Election Judges.

On the Face of the Returns Mr. McGill Has a Plurality of About 1,700.

The Result in Peltrami, Itasca and Carlton Counties Still Entirely Unknown.

Mayor Ames Remains Confident That He Will Take the Governor's Chair.

Nearly 1,800 Votes Known to Have Been Illegally Cast in Three Localities.

Heads at the Capitol That Are a Mark for the Next Governor's Guiltiness.

Canvassing the Returns.

The returning boards of the eighty counties in Minnesota make the official canvass of the votes cast on Tuesday last before midnight of to-morrow. Until this official canvass is made and announced the result will not be known, and at the present time it is impossible to state, with absolute positiveness, whether Ames or McGill is elected governor. Seventy-one counties have already announced their official vote, which is the only data that is strictly reliable. The vote of the other counties is simply estimated or based on reports sent in by correspondents before the official canvass was made. In the case of these latter counties the reports give the totals as gleaned from the judges of election—exactly similar to Ramsey and Hennepin counties, where the votes have not been counted by the judges, but not footed up by the official board designated to do the work. This will be done on Monday, and then the suspense will be at an end. The correct vote from seventy-three counties has been received at the GLOBE office, showing Ames to have received 19,814 votes and McGill 19,737 votes, or a majority of 17 for Ames.

REPORTS FROM CORRESPONDENTS In four counties have come to hand where the vote has been counted and announced officially. These counties show a total of 1,700 votes for Ames and 1,700 for McGill, or a total of 1,738 majority for McGill. No reports have been received from Beltrami, Itasca or Carlton counties, but they cannot be regarded as affecting the result. It would be well to bear in mind, however, that the returns from the "unofficial" counties will not do to depend upon absolutely. Errors in transmission by telegraph may have occurred, and other discrepancies may be found sufficient to wipe out a majority one way or the other. While, on the face of the returns received, McGill is in the lead, there is still room for Ames to win if there should happen to be a great many errors in the official returns reported.
