The inmates of the Ramsey county jail were yesterday made as happy as the circumstances by which they are surrounded, and the kind offices of a number of people outside of the jail could render them. About noon Sheriff Richter served all those in his charge with a generous dinner and all that thereto belongs, which was fully appreciated. About 3:30 in the afternoon, the St. Paul Jail Mission proceeded to the jail and gave the inmates what is called the "Annual Grand Concert." Besides the members of the board a number of other citizens were present to the number of about fifty. To render the concert more complete, Nathan Ford sent up a piano. The concert was prefaced by a few remarks by the president of the mission board, C. A. Stark, after which the concert proper was given. They had a printed programme, consisting of sixteen selections, embracing choruses, instrumental and vocal solos, recitations and vocal duets, all of which were well rendered and greatly pleased the unusual audience. Many of the songs caused some of the inmates to wear a sad and thoughtful appearance, and apparently brought to their minds many things they are not pleased to recall. After the concert was concluded the mission board distributed to the prisoners a generous supply of tobacco and cigars, for all of which they were apparently deeply grateful. Frank J. Mead and J. D. Isabel, both of whom are charged with murder, were not to be seen among the prisoners. Both sat up stairs and were apparently in no mood to participate in such an entertainment. Both appeared to be in very low spirits. The concert and presentations lasted about an hour and a half. THE FIRST GREAT PARADE.
