THIRD ANNUAL BANQUET.

The Jolly Jobbers and Their Friends Hold High Carnival.

The Jolly Jobbers' association has been known to have a little duffety once in a while in securing a quorum for business meetings, owing doubtless to the tremendous amount of private business that floods in on the members. Resolved, That we denounce the attempt to govern cities and counties by the legislature, created by act of the state legislature as a dangerous infringement on popular rights, an effort to centralize power in the hands of the few, a treacherous movement to defeat the will of the people in popular elections and a direct blow at that most sacred principle of our government, the right of self government; we therefore respectfully urge your honorable body to vote these schemes of centralization out of existence.

This resolution includes all the commissions of the legislature, and was passed by a unanimous vote. John Byrnes, on being called to the floor, said, in his forcible way, that "these commissions are simply schemes to down the people who represent the will of the people of Minneapolis. If we were not in office no such commissions would have been thought of. The scheme is being put up by a few rich men, monopolists, who want things to be run according to their own private interests, and who think because a man represents the people he can do nothing right."

Much of this is told in the "Lives of the Holy Men of the East," which is drawn from Buddhist sources.
