A Pennsylvanian Makes Death-Bed Confession of a Murder.

Killing of an Outlaw in the Southwest -- Chicago Bootleggers.

SHENANDOAH, Pa., March 30.—The mystery of a murder committed here seven years ago was cleared up by the death-bed confession of one of the murderers.

Chicago Bootleggers. CHICAGO, March 30.—The grand jury is rapidly accumulating evidence against several as yet unidentified bootleggers, but it is not expected that any more capias will be issued before Friday or Saturday.

An Outlaw Killed. DENVER, Col., March 30.—It was reported here last night that Marino Leyba, a notorious outlaw and desperado, and leader of a gang who terrorized Central New Mexico for six months, had been killed while resisting arrest at Antelope Springs.

The Rahway Murder. RAHWAY, N. J., March 30.—There are no clues to the murderer of the young woman who was killed here last Friday night, and her body is still unidentified.

Newark, N. J., March 30.—Supt. Harrison, of the Newark home, yesterday identified the body of the murdered girl as that of Mary Malby, a former inmate of the institution.
