The Result of a Day's Investigations of the Globe's Faber Welders in the Flour City. Use to Be Made of the Potter Process in the Buxton Smelters in the Black Hills. Evangelical Association Ministers Assigned—Elias Nelson Indicted for Manslaughter. The Force of Policemen Considerably Agitated Over Prospective Commission Action.

THE POTTER PROCESS

To Be Used by the Buxton Smelters in the Black Hills. A big contract was signed yesterday, the first of the several Potter Mining & Smelting companies expect to make. The article published in the Globe some time ago attracted general attention in all gold and silver mining circles and among others in the works of the Buxton company, at the Black Hills. President Anthony, of that company, came to Minneapolis, and had an interview with the officers of the Potter company, and then went to Chicago, where he held a conference with the inventor, Mr. A. Potter. The result was that yesterday a contract was signed, and the Potter process will be introduced into the Buxton smelter. Mr. Potter is to go to Chicago to get the necessary machinery to erect a smelter for ten days, in which time it will be thoroughly tested, and if it proves what is expected the Potter company is to pay the Potter a good bonus and a royalty of \$1 per ton. Mr. Anthony brought an expert smelter with him, and both were satisfied of the coming revolution in the process of smelting the precious ores.

NOT A MURDER.

Elias Nelson Held for Manslaughter—Ball Fixed. The municipal court examined yesterday afternoon during the examination of Elias Nelson, charged with the murder of Elias Johnson. The testimony submitted by the state was the same given by witnesses at the coroner's inquest. The defense submitted no testimony, and Judge Hollis, defendant's counsel, moved for a dismissal of the charge of murder in the first degree, claiming that no evidence had been submitted showing any intention, or possession of a knife, or any of the elements which constituted murder. On the contrary, there was every indication that the killing was premeditated. Assistant County Attorney Jamison argued that the defendant should be held on the charge of murder until the grand jury decided the degree of crime committed. Judge Hollis granted the motion for dismissal. Nelson was then arraigned upon a warrant charging him with manslaughter in the first degree. Examination was waived, and the ball fixed him to the grand jury was fixed at \$2,000, and it was finally reduced to \$1,500 at the request of Judge Hollis.

A LIVELY MEETING.

Policy Holders Not Favorable to Their Present Certificates. For a long time past a large number of the policy holders in the Educational Endowment association have been feeling somewhat dissatisfied at each meeting of the directors, as the manner in which they were drawn appeared to have a loophole for a good sized steel on the part of the officers of the company. This feeling was increased when it had been done of late, and last evening a meeting of the disgruntled members, headed by Dr. Rogers, was held at 23 Washington avenue south, just below the meeting opened by Mr. Merritt, the secretary, (and in fact the founder and owner of the association) put in an appearance and started in to tell what a splendid company the association was in regard to the soundness of the policies that had been issued, but answered none of them in a satisfactory manner. Dr. Rogers then explained that the policies read that the company would pay to policy holders at the expiration of the time for which they were issued three-quarters of the assessed amount on all policies in force at the time of the expiration of the policy. The money to be paid to the policy holder, he said, was not to be paid to be very little, as in all probability there would be but one or two policies in force then. Some one wanted to know how this would be, and the doctor continued: "Well, the company now has a reserve fund of \$500,000. The rates for insurance have been raised once and will, most likely, be raised again, so that a high figure that no new member can come in. The old members will gradually drop out and then there will be the last few policy holders get their money as there will be only a few policies in force? I do not say that the officers of the association are rogues, but if rogues should get control you can all see the result. The policy certificates are now ready for every opportunity in the world for a big steal. Now in regard to there being new policies issued, with this defect remedied, as Mr. Merritt has stated. Some weeks ago I saw this defect and spoke to Mr. Merritt in regard to it. He told me that new policies all round would be issued in the place of the old ones in ten days. It is now nearly two months since he said this, but none of us have seen any new policies yet, and in my opinion are we likely to see them. If the policy certificates are not to be very little, as in all probability there will be, as the matter stands now the \$500,000 reserve fund will go directly to the officers of the company. This they cannot deny."
