IT WILL BE WELL ADJUSTED.

The Statesman Says Both Nations Will Come Out of the Trouble Honorably.

"We have adjourned our deliberations on the fisheries question until the 4th of January, 1888," said Sir Charles Tupper, of Ottawa, as he sat in his parlor at the Ryan yesterday afternoon, "when we will reassemble at Washington and continue the second session. I hope that a satisfactory solution of the problem is reached. It was agreed by the commissioners that the nature of our discussions should be kept secret, and hence I am not at liberty to divulge anything that has transpired since we came to town. But, however, it is my belief that there is a good prospect of the representatives of the greatest English speaking nations of the earth reaching a conclusion which will be mutually satisfactory and honorable to both governments. Otherwise, we should not have adjourned to the date mentioned, but would have continued our labors and reported that we could not agree. During my stay at Washington I was brought in contact with a number of Washington representatives of both political parties from all parts of the United States, and I found all of them favorably disposed toward the commission and its objects, and my impression is that the treaty which will be agreed upon which will meet with the approval of congress and her majesty's government, and settle for all time the controversy at present existing between Canada and the United States. There is no good reason why amicable relations should not exist between two countries, and my efforts in this direction will be met half-way by those entrusted with the interests of the Dominion.
