Thursday night the city council granted a franchise to the Enos Electric Railway company to construct an elevated road through West St. Paul, and across the river to Second Street.

The idea of the company has been to construct the road through this city to Minneapolis, with a view of connecting the two cities by a continuous build up the space between the two towns.

Whether this vision of property will be realized for ever to demonstrate. One thing is certain, and that is that the people of St. Paul have reason to complain of the inadequate means of cheap and convenient transportation for their city.

The conditions of the grant by the council, however, are of such a character that there is some doubt as to whether or not the charter will be accepted by the people.

Little is known about elevated railways, and people think it would be the ruin of all the property along the streets from Broadway to Hennepin.

Seventh and Eighth streets continue to attract more attention than any other streets in town. The proposition before the council to practically open Eighth street to the bluff at Second street has been mentioned already in these columns.
