FIREMEN ADDRESSED.

Able Papers Read Yesterday at the Convention of the Fire Engineers.

Various Subjects Discussed by Men Who Know What They Talk About.

The Convention Favors Shorter Hours—An Interesting Talk on Oil Tanks.

The Evening Session an Animated One—Programme for To-Day.

At 10 o'clock yesterday morning, when the second day's session of the firemen's convention opened, there was a large attendance, and in order that no one might escape the president appointed Chief Shepard, of Knoxville, Tenn., sergeant at arms. The reading of papers was next taken up, the first one read was on "The propriety of recommending shorter hours for a day's work for paid firemen," by J. W. Dickenson, of Cleveland, O.

Firemen knew no holidays, the speaker said, and did not even have time to attend religious services. The 10,000 firemen in the United States, about 7,000 are married, he continued, and it is indeed seldom that any one of them has a day's rest. The departments allow the firemen half an hour for meals. This is far too short, and does not give a fireman time to attend to his family or to his own needs. When we consider that some firemen are not allowed to go out of the engine house while on duty, it is no wonder that so many of the men have their hours of domestic life. The life of a fireman is at the best not an easy one. All seasons are the same to him, and when he does get a day off he generally works hard all day at home. The men are a rule generous, and never turn a poor person away from them empty handed.

Of late years they have been studying the most modern steam and similar things, and for this reason some people seem to think that they should know the whereabouts of every lost child in the city. Every one would point to the fact that shorter hours for firemen are necessary. If the hours were shorter the men would have more time to spend at home, and to keep their premises in better repair. Then again it would induce firemen to get a home of their own, where they could bring up their children out of the reach of the crowded tenement houses. This convention should act in this matter, and it seems to me that all firemen should be given at least eight hours of every day. At the conclusion of the paper Chief Dickinson moved that the convention recommend shorter hours. This motion was unanimously carried.

A FEW "STILL ALARMS."

The deluge pipe is one of the articles on exhibition, and receives considerable attention by the various delegates.

The deluge pipe is really a large discharge pipe or hose, and is intended for service at large fires. It attaches to the patent hose coupling, and takes the concentrated or entire pumping capacity of one, two, three or four engines at the same time, and delivers the water through the deluge pipe and one nozzle from 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 inches in diameter at the rate of 1,000 to 3,000 gallons per minute. On the deluge pipe are permanent leather handles, by which the pipe can be easily carried. The pipe is complete, with couplings, weighs seventy-five pounds per section of fifty feet.

Chief Edward Hughes, of Louisville, Ky., has a badge valued at \$3,000, presented to him by the citizens.
