Thirty Years' Active Service in the Saddle.

AN OLD INDIAN FIGHTER.

Col. Dudley, of Fort Custer, and His Brilliant Record--A Credit to the Old Bay State.

Nathan A. M. Dudley, First United States Cavalry, now commanding Fort Custer, Mont., has been relieved from his present command and

to proceed to his home and wait retirement. In view of the facts that Col. Dudley will not be eligible for retirement by operation of law until August 30, next, and that the telegraphic information which enables us to make the announcement is silent as to the reasons which have influenced the secretary of war to set his official seal to the action stated, it is thought that Col. Dudley may have availed himself of the thirty years' service law, and requested some retirement. However, it may be, the colonel has kept his own council in the matter and his most intimate friends will read of the fact stated with as much genuine surprise as the most remote officer or soldier in the service. Col. Dudley is a native of Massachusetts.

His military history, which is one of the most famous in the records and department dates from March 3, 1855, when he was commissioned a first lieutenant in the Tenth United States Infantry, which veteran regiment he served in the organization of the regiment's birth and the lieutenant's commission being identical. Entering immediately upon active service in the field, Lieut. Dudley participated in the Sioux Indian expedition of that year. In the bloody action of Ash Hollow, where he was in command of his company, and in the defeat of the Cheyenne Indians at Platte Bridge, Neb., he displayed such heroism and valor as won for him conspicuous mention. In 1857, he was promoted to the rank of captain, and in 1858, he was promoted to the rank of major. He was engaged in the Utah expedition, which he commanded, and in the expedition to Vicksburg, and with the batteries of his regiment participated in the fight during the passage of Fort Fisher, and in the capture of the city of Vicksburg.
