

## THE PRESIDENT OF THE GREAT BREWING COMPANY.

"The name of Capt. Fred Pabst, the President of the great brewing company that now bears his name, is inseparably connected with the Philip Best Brewing Company, the largest institution of its kind in the world, and a few weeks ago he was honored by the stockholders substituting his name for that of one of the original founders. The history of the concern, which has been so potent an agent in making exceedingly small way, as far back as 1842, by Jacob Best, who was assisted by his sons, Philip, Charles, Jacob, Jr., and Lorenz. All of the work necessarily small, being limited to two or three hundred barrels per year, and intended only to meet a local demand. After various changes the whole business passed into the hands of Philip Best in 1860.
