A. J. Blithen's purchase of the Tribune became an accomplished fact yesterday, when the purchaser paid over his money, received the stock, and gave the foreman orders to haul down the "Haskell and Palmer" colors that have run at the masthead for a year past.

Blithen said last night in a Globe report: "The deal is completed. The Tribune is purchased by me for \$250,000, and William Henry Smith, who has been detained by the Johnston flood and has not yet returned, is the only person who has not yet received his share of the money. He will receive it as soon as he is able to return to the city."

"Of course it is a matter of some gratification to me that in a year after the Haskell and Palmer era, I return to the proprietorship of the Tribune on my own terms, for they came to my figure rather than that I would have had to accept of a price which I was able to make them listen to a proposition to buy at all. SCRAP BOOKS. They Can Be Made the Means of Gathering a Work of Great Value.

If farmers, dairymen, and, in fact, men of every profession would keep a life, or for soon as they are married, to carefully prepare a scrap book of valuable receipts, they would soon have a book which would be valuable, says the agricultural editor of the Des Moines Register. This is more essential to the farmer, long distance editor, than to any other class of people. Many of the agricultural papers of the country have veterinary departments conducted by long distance editors in this class who give weekly directions for the treatment of domestic animals in actual cases of disease. Were these directions, as well as other receipts of this kind, collected and arranged in a scrap book, every farmer would soon have a scrap book worth more than a hundred dollars.
