Wood Preserving.

Few besides architects and engineers who have made a study of timber preservation are aware of the enormous destruction of timber which is continually going on from the ravages of decay and the attacks of insects.

The question of prolonging the life of timber in all structures designed to last long periods of time has agitated the minds of engineers for years, and many different methods of treatment have been devised; but none of them are perfectly satisfactory, either from the cost of materials used or the expensive method of its application, or from the nature of the materials themselves.

Zinc preparations are very expensive, and the natural oils containing creosote, such as dead oil, etc., have poisonous exhalations, which make them unfit for use in structures above ground.

Recently a new form of creosote oil has been developed which is called Fernoline. It is distilled from the fat pine of the Southern woods, and contains a very large proportion of true creosote, as against the carbolic acid which is used in the principal component. This creosote is accompanied by heavy tar oils and paraffine, which penetrate wood deeply.

The action of the creosote itself coagulates the albuminous matter and prevents fermentation. As the material hardens it crystallizes in the structure of the wood and renders it impervious to moisture. One of the great points claimed for this new material is that it will penetrate wood very deeply when applied with a brush, or when wood is soaked in it, displacing with the machinery and plant needed to force the materials into the timber which are required when ordinary materials are used.

Fernoline is well and favorably known in the Eastern part of the country, having been used by railroad engineers for the past five or six years with very satisfactory results in car construction and for the treating of bridge timber, and recently by the New York Central road for the treating of ties.

One advantage of Fernoline for the general public is the coating with it of old shingles, as it is so absorbent that, when applied in thick coats, shingles that are curled and warped will fill up, straighten out and harden, making an old leaky roof tight and durable.

The material is manufactured by the Fernoline Chemical Company of New York, who control all the patents covering the distillation process used in its manufacture. This company's headquarters are in New York and their factories at Charleston, S. C.
