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OLSEN IS CONVICTED,

But He Is Satisfied That Jury Found It Man-slaughter.

Unger Pleads for Clemency and Gets Off With a Single Year.

Jennie Hendrickson Has Another Show for Her White Allie.

Court Briefs That Show the Current of Local Litigation.

At 8:15 o'clock last night the jury in the case of Andrew Olson brought in a verdict of guilty of manslaughter.

The principal witness examined yesterday was the prisoner. He claimed that he killed Dalstrom in self defense.

They became engaged in a fight, Dalstrom grabbed Olson by the throat, drew a knife and slashed him in the face.

Olson then pulled his knife and cut Dalstrom in the arm, inflicting the wound which resulted in his death.
