

READY TO CRY QUILTS

Bismarck's Terms of Peace Between Austria and Russia Partly Fulfilled.

The Czar Has Stopped the Pan-Slavist Agitation in Bulgaria.

Austria's August Ruler Grants Trentino an Autonomous Local Administration.

Young Kaiser Wilhelm Proposes to Cut a Wide Swath Socially.

BERLIN, Nov. 23.—The terms of peace between Austria and Russia which Prince Bismarck forced upon Count Kaloky are already partly fulfilled on the Russian side.

RESENTING THE SUGGESTION of the cession of Trentino to Italy, has consented to grant to Trentino an autonomous local administration, separate from the German Tyrol, of which it has hitherto formed a part.
