THE FIRST WOMAN SENT TO THE NEW REFORMATORY. The habeas corpus case of Mary Summerfield was determined by Judge Simmons yesterday.

The case of Burton Barnham against George W. Hicks and John R. Joslyn to recover \$10,000 damages for loss of property by reason of the cutting in of a ditch, is on trial before a jury in Judge Kelly's court.

The case of John H. Healy et al. against Edgar C. Varney et al., to recover \$2,000 damages for failure to consummate a trade of real estate, is on trial before a jury in Judge Kelly's court.

In the suit of Eleanor Schaeffer against George W. Hicks, to recover damages for loss of laundry business for changing the course of Platen creek, a verdict for \$10 was awarded the plaintiff.

The case of John E. Dooley against the Dennis Ryan, Judge Kelly made an order to the effect that plaintiff is entitled to the use of the land for the rate of 11 per cent, which after deducting payments made, leaves now due \$46,345.56, for which sum judgment is entered.

NEW SUITS BEGUN. The Powers Dry Goods company sued J. C. Brennescholtz for \$705, balance for merchandise.

C. S. Anderson sued F. Beyer & Co. for \$875, balance due for grading a piece of land.

W. J. Woolsey sued A. Hawley to recover \$84, and garnishes the Northern Pacific railroad.

Spangler & Dyer, who sued August Spangler, garnishes F. E. Chipman, who, it is claimed, owes defendant \$25.

Gustaf Larson sued Henry Anderson and Charles Magnusson on a promissory note for \$75.

Arthur Sautas sued the city of St. Paul for \$100 received from the clerk of the municipal court for the plaintiff's use.

P. W. Hurty brought suit, with an attachment upon his effects, against A. J. Bedford for \$383.80, due on a promissory note.

Peter Fautholt sued C. Anderson for \$147.37; costs for labor performed.

Margie Seaman has begun an action against Mrs. M. Turner and others for partition or sale of lots 10, 12 and 13, block 4, Arlington Hills addition, and a division of the property or proceeds of the same.

Herbert W. Smith and C. H. Ashby have sued the Western Home Insurance company for \$300, the amount of insurance claimed to have been agreed to be paid to Anderson & Mathews and by them assigned to plaintiffs.

In an action against directors of a corporation for misfeasance or culpable negligence in the discharge of their official duty, the corporation, and not the stockholders, are the proper party plaintiffs.

The form of the action may be legal or equitable, according to the circumstances of particular cases.

Where a corporation is personally liable if they suffer the corporate funds or property to be wasted or lost by gross negligence and intention to the duties of their trust.
