Entries for the Twin City Meeting to Close Next Wednesday.

Six Stake Events With Upwards of \$30,000 in Added Money.

The American Trotting Association Now Covers the Whole Western Field.

Entries for the six stakes opened by the Twin City Jockey club for the second summer meeting, to be held at Hamline, beginning July 23, and also the fixtures for 1891, close next Wednesday, Jan. 15, and present indications are that the club will be liberally supported by Western owners.

SUNDAY AT STILLWATER. A Receiver for the Sawyer House Said To Have Been Appointed.
