WASHINGTON, Feb. 24.—Excepting a few moments occupied in administering the oath of office to John E. Reuburn, of Pennsylvania, the new member who succeeds the late Judge Kelley, the house spent the entire session to-day in settling the question of the site for the world's fair. Eight ballots were taken, and on the eighth and last ballot Chicago secured 157 votes, and the prize. When Speaker Reed rapped for order at noon there were about 300 representatives on the floor, the galleries were crowded with people waiting to witness the struggle between the adherents of the rival cities on the floor. Chancery M. Depew and ex-Secretary Whitney and others from New York City; Mayor Cregar, of Chicago; Gov. Francis, of St. Louis, and a host of representative men from these cities and many Washington men, members of the original board of promotion, were present. On the eighth ballot, the speaker directed the clerk to again call the roll. So the reading clerk again began his task. There was a good deal of ill-suppressed excitement visible, which was hardly justified by the result, although the New York and Chicago men professed their satisfaction.
