WHAT PRINTERS WILL DO. Their Meeting To-morrow Likely to Result in Something Definite.

The threatened printers strike now seems destined to be postponed for some time. The action of the typographical union in refusing to grant the nine-hour day will be considered Sunday at the regular meeting of the union. Should the union not desire to reconsider its action on the nine-hour matter, a committee of three, representing the pressmen, the typographical union and the Scandinavian printers union, will be appointed to act in endeavor to settle the whole matter, and should they fail it will go before the International Typographical union, which will meet at Atlanta, Ga. in about two weeks. There is some talk of proposing a compromise on nine and half hours per day, but whether this will be known in the matter until after the meeting of to-morrow.

She Had Not Recovered. Michaela Anderson, the wife of Swan Anderson, who lives at 917 Sixteenth avenue northeast, who has been confined in the asylum for the insane at St. Peter, was discharged from that institution yesterday by the physician who recovered.
