Raum Has No Intention of Resigning.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6.—Concerning the statement that he was about to resign his office because of charges against him, Pension Commissioner Raum says in an interview published here today: "There is not a single word of truth in the whole story. I have not resigned, and I have no intention of doing so."
