WASHINGTON, Oct. 6.—The annual report of the commissioner of pensions for the fiscal year ended June 30 last, and including the first quarter of the current fiscal year, of the operations of his bureau, was submitted to the secretary of the interior today. It shows that at the end of the fiscal year there were 537,944 pensioners borne upon the rolls. There were 63,367 more than were allowed in 1888. The amount of the first payment of these claims aggregated \$32,478,841, being \$11,036,492 more than in the previous fiscal year and \$10,179,225 more than the first payments of the fiscal year 1888.

A Nebraska Girl Kills Herself With Poison.

PALMERA, Neb., Oct. 6.—There is intense excitement here over the mysterious death of a young girl named Dolly Leshere. Late last night James Rudge, the girl's brother-in-law, saw her enter the place of business of E. Lottman and followed. When he arrived the girl had disappeared, and Lottman said she had fled to the rooming house of a woman building to escape some young men on the street. About 11 o'clock last night Dolly was seen to enter the rooming house. Two gentlemen who were trying to save clothing from their rooms were seen to enter the rooming house. The loss on building and furniture amounted to \$8,000. The fire was put out in a few moments, water and smoke doing the most of the damage.

SCHELY'S SAD MISSION.

He Completes Delivery of Ericsson's Remains to Sweden.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 6.—Capt. Schley, commander of the United States steamer Baltimore, in a letter to the navy department today, dated Stockholm, Sweden, Sept. 21, announces his arrival at that port with the remains of the inventor Ericsson. The remains were delivered to the authorities Sunday, Sept. 21, and were interred in the cemetery with appropriate ceremonies. The ceremony was magnificent in character, and thousands of people lined the route of the funeral procession. During the passage of the funeral cortege through the streets of Stockholm twenty-five salutes were fired from the deck of the Baltimore, and her flag was placed at half mast. Capt. Schley adds that Ericsson's remains were received and honored with the most imposing consideration by his government. Sept. 19, King Oscar of Sweden, his secretary of state and staff officers paid a visit to the Baltimore, and were received with all the honors due a distinguished officer of the navy. King Oscar expressed himself as highly pleased with his visit, and Capt. Schley to send his congratulations to President Harrison on having such a magnificent vessel.
