Law Laid Down in Decisions of the Appellate Court.

Two Reversals, One of Which Is a Railway Damage Suit.

The supreme court yesterday handed down four decisions, one of which, Jefferson vs. The Northern Pacific Road, reversed the ruling of the lower court.

Thomas Jefferson sued, as an infant, through his next of kin, his father, for damages sustained while working for the company.

The syllabus in the cases are as follows: Patrick Jefferson, respondent, vs. The Northern Pacific Railroad Company, appellant. Judgment reversed and new trial granted.

The Two Clarke Suits. Thomas G. Clarke, respondent, vs. N. P. Clarke, appellant.

Syllabus—The court, by its instructions, having informed the jury that only certain specified issues were in controversy, and no exception having been taken.

The rejection of evidence cannot be deemed to have been prejudicial, the parties having subsequently, in the course of the trial agreed upon the fact to which such evidence was relevant.

Fire Set by a Spark. Mary Carlson, respondent, against the Eastern Railway Company of Minnesota, appellant.

Syllabus—In an action to recover for property destroyed by a fire set by a railroad locomotive, a verdict involving a finding of negligence by the negligence of the locomotive sustained, in view of the statutory presumption of negligence and the failure to show whether the defendant had the engine and four feet long, at the front and rear of the ash pan beneath the fire bar.
