FRIGHTFUL ACCIDENT.

In Excursion Train in Switzerland Breaks Through a Bridge.

At Least Sixty Persons Either Crushed to Death or Drowned.

The List of the Injured Foots Up Not Less Than One Hundred.

Revolt of Arabs in Yemen--Over One Hundred Men Killed.

BRILIN, June 14.—A fearful accident is reported from Switzerland. A railroad bridge across the Moenichen, a small affluent of the Rhine, at Stein, in the Canton of Basel, not far from Germany, gave way to-day under the weight of an excursion train, crowded with throngs of people who were on their way to a musical fête. The two engines and the first car with all its passengers, first plunged into the river, while cars remained suspended over the stream. All the trainmen were killed and every passenger in the submerged car was drowned. Thirteen cars were saved. The number of killed was at least sixty, and those injured not less than 100. The fearful calamity has caused a terrible shock in Switzerland and South Germany. Rescuers hastened to the scene, and the injured were taken care of. The musical fête at Moenichen was abandoned as soon as the news of the accident arrived, and hundreds of the villagers hurried to the scene to assist in rescuing the victims. The bridge was an iron skeleton structure, which was considered well built and substantial. The only apparent reason for the collapse of the bridge is that the train left the rails and threw its entire weight on one side of the bridge.

KILLED BY ARABS.

A Revolt in Which Several Soldiers Are Slaughtered.

CONSTANTINOPLE, June 14.—News has been received that the Arabs in Yemen have revolted, and have attacked the imperial troops, forcing them to retreat. The troops lost several officers and 100 men. The grand council has decided to despatch 10,000 troops from the Syrian garrisons.

ASIAN ADVICES.

Nearly 200 Houses Burned at Yarmouchi.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 14.—The steamer City of Rio De Janeiro arrived from Hong Kong and Yokohama last night bringing the following advices: Fire at Yarmouchi destroyed 193 houses. Foreign railroad engineers engaged on the Loushan railroad were attacked by the Cantonese and had to fly to Tatsien for safety. They were sent back by means of false telegrams, promising them a motor car, and were again compelled to fly for their lives. Robbers are said to have increased from an average of 150 to 300 per month in Yokohama and other ports. The passenger steamer Takachi Maru, Capt. Walker commanding, was lost during a fog on May 10 on Japan coast. The passengers were rescued by a social meeting was suppressed by the police in Yokohama May 10. The Russian minister has received several letters from Japanese since the attempt on the life of the czarowitz. The Japanese authorities have decided to stop the emigration of Chinese women to America, by refusing to issue passports them. The British steamer Quana ran into the Japanese coast, sank the vessel and killed on man. Several directors of police have been dismissed for carelessness in connection with the assassination of the czarowitz. Ten thousand telegrams from different parts of Japan were received by the czarowitz. CUT OFF THEIR HEADS.

How Fifteen Bad Chinamen Met Their Death.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 14.—Details of the execution of fifteen Chinese at Keon town City, opposite Hong Kong, May 11, were received last night by the steamer Rio Janeiro. Six of the men were pirates, and looted the passenger steamer Nanao, which was on the coast. The fifteen doomed men knelt in a row in the public square and the executioner cut off their heads with a sword. It was all done in a few minutes. Details of riots from Wuhu are received. A mob of fully 10,000 Chinese attacked the French mission on May 11. The Catholic cathedral was burned and Mr. Russell's house wrecked. The English consulate was attacked and the consul and his wife barely escaped, disguised as Chinese. Residences of custom officers were burned.

Pounded by Parker.

BLAINE OR GRESHAM.

The Indianapolis Conference Considers Both of These Gentlemen.

Gresham's Inability to Reconcile Hostile Factions May Shut Him Out.

He Is, However, Recognized as Very Popular Among the Workingmen.

Strong Argument in Favor of Blaine by Col. Conger, of Ohio.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., June 14.—The Blaine conference has caused a profound political sensation. Indiana Republicans are not likely soon to get talking about it. The friends of the president are greatly disturbed, though they say there was nothing in the conference to cause surprise, as it has been understood all along that the men who are at the head of the Blaine movement would oppose the nomination of Harrison quite as vigorously in 1892 as they did in 1888, and they would select as their candidate anyone they might deem of the greatest popularity. They claim to have had information several days ago that the conference was about to be held, and that it would be made the occasion for starting a new presidential campaign for the coming year, but that Judge Gresham would again be put forward as the candidate of the anti-Harrison Republicans. The president's supporters call the leaders of the new movement the "kickers," and speak lightly of the conference. H. C. Adams, one of the most influential of the few Harrison men who have not been taken away from a federal appointment, says of the prospect of the Blaine boom: "These kickers are like the third-party men; they are making a good deal of noise."

HARRISON'S WEAKNESS.

Col. Conger Discusses the Discontent in Indiana.

AKRON, O., June 14.—Col. A. L. Conger, of the Republican national committee, who was present at the session of Harrison administration secret session in Indianapolis yesterday, arrived home this morning. Col. The Cargo of the City of Richmond Becomes Ignited at Sea.

QUEENSTOWN, June 14.—The Curragh hulk steamer Servia, Capt. Dutton, which left New York June 8, arrived here to-day. The captain reports that at midnight of Thursday he sighted the hulk steamer City of Richmond, Capt. Redford, from New York, June 8, bound for this port and Liverpool. The latter vessel was flying signals of distress, and the Servia bore down to her to offer assistance. The captain of the City of Richmond said his cargo was on fire and the Servia stood by and steamed slowly by the side of the City of Richmond until a row head was sighted. Capt. Redford reported that Tuesday at midnight a lady cabin passenger, upon getting out of her berth, noticed that the floor of the stateroom was very hot. She immediately gave the alarm to the engineers, who communicated with the captain, and an examination was quickly made. This resulted in the discovery that smoke was issuing from the fore hold, and the smell indicated that the cotton in the hold was on fire.
