Hal Pointer Again Succumbs to the Fleetest Pacer on Earth.

Three Heats on a New Kite Track in 2:09, 2:08 and 2:08 3-4.

The World's Record in a Race to Harness Is Beaten Out of Sight.

Wind Was a Winner at Independence--The Running Tracks.

COLUMBIA, Tenn., Oct. 26.—The great match race between Direct and Hal Pointer attracted an immense crowd to Columbia today, and they were rewarded by a great race, though the home favorite fell a victim of the staying qualities of the Californian.

The second race was the match race, with a purse of \$3,000, and an additional \$1,000 if the world's record was broken. The heats were three in number, and in each the result was a victory for Direct.

Third Heat.—On even terms they leave the wire, and such racing as these two did was never before seen or heard of. Flying past the first quarter they were on even terms, and when they flew to the turn at the half Direct led by a length, and a groan went up from the excited crowd, for they reckon that the match is over.


