KILLED BY THE BOW.

A Murder Sensation Dwindles to King Alcohol's Tyranny.

Two Men Evidently Killed by Unlimited Strong Potations.

Latourelle Is Acquitted and Regales Court With a Speech.

Weide, the Missing Real Estate Man, Found at Last.

Yesterday morning shortly before 11 information was given to the police that two men named Charles Whalen and Edward Ryan had been found dead in their beds in the same room in the Manitoba house, on Third and Broadway.

On the arrival of the police officers Whalen was found to be dead, but Ryan was still alive. He was vomiting considerably, and a few minutes after the police took charge of the case the man died. Rumors were quickly flying round the city that both men had been murdered, but the post mortem examination, which was held last evening at the morgue, would indicate that the deaths were due to alcoholism, and were only remarkable from the strange condition of occurring at the same time and place. The police made a most rigid examination of the case and its surroundings, and placed under arrest the companions of the dead men who had on the previous evening indulged in a drunken frolic. All the men were brought to the police station, where they have been working with the police.

Whalen arrived in the city on Sunday and has been drunk ever since, while Ryan, who arrived three weeks ago, has, according to the statements made, simply lived on whisky and beer. Whalen and Ryan have been at the Manitoba house, and frequenting all the saloons in the vicinity. On Wednesday evening they were in the saloon of the Minnesota home drinking with a number of men. Whalen had a fight with a man named James Mulek, who was stopping there, and was knocked down a number of times. Ryan took no part in the fight, and eventually the men were separated and Mulek went up to bed, while the rest of the men went over to the Manitoba house. After eating a number of drinks of beer, the bartender named Mulek, who was stopping there, took all the men up to bed, as the porter was sick. All the men were very drunk at the time, and went to sleep in their clothes. There were four beds in the room; Gleason occupied one, while six men slept in the others, the men being Whalen and Ryan, who are dead, Whalen's brother Pat, Dan Tierney, John Gallagher and another man, whose name is not known, and who has not yet been arrested.

Gleason made a statement to Chief Clark, that when he got up at 6 yesterday morning the men, who have since died, were all right, for Ryan called to him to stop talking and let him sleep. Dan Tierney also stated that when he left the room, Whalen, with whom he slept, seemed to be all right. All the men except Whalen and Ryan left the room before 10 o'clock.
