Identity Not Yet Established.—Mr. Sage All Right.

NEW YORK, Dec. 5.—The Arcade building, at which the dynamite explosion occurred yesterday, was visited by thousands of people this morning.

Washington E. Connor said he called Russell Sage this morning at his house and found him looking quite bright and cheerful. He will be all right again in a few days.

Police Inspector Byrnes after visiting the scene this morning, said that the man who threw the bomb evidently knew Mr. Sage by sight, and waited for him to come out of the private office before he advanced to the window and made known his business.

Mr. Byrnes said that Mr. Sage was not in the least excited when the head of the dynamite was thrown at his home last night. He sat up in bed, looked at the head critically and said: "That is the man. I remember the face well."
