D., March 2.—The supreme court today rendered the following very important opinion, of special interest to capitalists and aliens: "One of the locators of an unpatented mining claim, duly and legally located by citizens of the United States in 1877, covered his interest in said claim in 1883 to an alien, who in 1889, prior to the re-location of such claim by the defendant, conveyed the same to the plaintiff, a corporation qualified to locate, hold and purchase the mineral lands of the United States."
