WASHINGTON, April 4.—The expectation of an interesting discussion on the silver question, based upon Mr. Morgan's resolution instructing the committee on finance to examine and report upon certain phases of the subject, seemed to have no particularly attractive power on the general public or the galleries, and even less than the usual number of spectators were present when the session of the day began, but there was a fair attendance of senators.

The famous McGarran claim made its regular reappearance in the senate today in the shape of a bill reported by Mr. Teller from the committee to submit to the court of claims the title of McGarran to the grant of land so long claimed by him. It was placed on the calendar.

In opening, Mr. Morgan said he knew that the subject was one which struck the attention of senators in an alarming way, because the people of the United States were very earnest in their desire to have some relief from the existing financial condition and embarrassment.
