Every Legal Citizen Compelled to Personally Attend to This.

The New Law Prohibits the Copying of the Old Voting Lists.

Complete List of the Registration Places Throughout the City.

Every voter who expects to vote at the coming city election in this city should register today.

The judges and clerks will be at all the polling places between the hours of 9 a. m. and 9 p. m. to attend to the registration of all voters.

Three more days will be devoted to this work of registration, as follows: Tuesday, April 12; Saturday, April 17, and Wednesday, April 21.

The polls opening at 9 o'clock in the morning and closing at 5 in the evening of each of these days.

Under the new law passed at the last session the polls on election day, May 25, will be open from 9 a. m. to 7 p. m.

While it may seem strange that an old citizen, who has resided in the same precinct for three or forty years, is obliged to register or lose his vote, it is the law.
