TALKS TO TAMMANY. Patriotic Celebration by New York's Big and Powerful Organization.

New York, July 4.—The one hundred and sixteenth anniversary of American independence was celebrated on an elaborate scale this morning by the Tammany society, or Columbian order, in the Fourteenth street wigwag.

The private boxes were occupied by large and distinguished companies of American independence as the members themselves.

Among them were Hon. Charles H. Gibson, of Maryland; W. N. Bryan, of Nebraska; W. H. Craik, of Texas; John O. Pendleton, of West Virginia; Benjamin A. Enloe, of Tennessee; L. F. The flag of the Tammany society floated from the roof of the hall, while the interior was beautifully decorated with silk flags, the coats of arms of the different states and floral designs.
