SIGN OF WEAKNESS.

The Assembly and Its Action on the Como Electric Extension.

A Resolution Recalled Which Had Been Sent to the Mayor.

Workingmen Pass Resolutions on the Home-Steal Outrage.

There were but six members of the assembly present when the city clerk called the roll at 8 o'clock last night.

The pay rolls for the street and sewer force, amounting to \$20,522.31, cover house and city hall, \$2,750, and Grand bridge, sewer and local assessment, \$1,852.25, were passed.

The ordinance increasing the amount of certificates of indebtedness for the street and sewer fund, \$10,000, authorized at a recent meeting, to \$15,000, could not be passed owing to there not being the necessary three-fourths vote present.

Assemblyman Johnson, who must either be a mind-reader or stands very close to the mayor, asked that the ordinance instructing the street railway company to complete the line into Grand Central be passed.

The ordinance had passed both branches of the council and lay in the hands of the mayor. Mr. Johnson said he had been informed that under the ordinance granted the street railway company they were not compelled to lay lines on streets where no business was conducted.

He intimated the mayor was going to veto the ordinance and in order to get the ordinance passed he had had the ordinance recalled. There was some question as to whether the ordinance could do any business aside from that mentioned in the call for the meeting, but Mr. Johnson insisted on his motion to recall was finally put to a vote and carried.

It was claimed at the meeting of the committee on streets that the ordinance in the ordinance which required the construction of sewers on streets before the company could be compelled to construct lines had been waived in this particular case. The waiving of this clause of the ordinance, however, claims when the sewer is constructed the line will be extended.

THE REFORMERS.

Assemblymen Will Not Work in the Dark.

Messrs. Lightner and Pike, representing the committee on ways and means of the assembly, held a session yesterday afternoon. Robert Seeger asked to have his bill for street lighting for the month of May passed.

Mr. Seeger's bill, which would cost \$7,965.60, approved. Mr. Lightner said the committee did not intend to act like figure heads on matters they did not understand. Mr. Pike said the same or nodded his head at Mr. Lightner's statement. The first objection raised to the bill was that the clerk of the board of public works had not properly signed them. Mr. Seeger journeyed to the controller's office and returned with the contract. A perusal of the contract showed the bills did not have the proper approval of the board of public works, and the bills were marked O. K.

The bond of the German-American bank was reported to be in correct form by the city engineer, according to the attorney, was present, and thought he should be allowed \$15,000 for damages in running the sewer through his property. He based his claim on the fact that his tenants, now occupying houses on the bank of the creek, would be cut off from their water supply if the creek were covered over and used for a sewer. Parties representing the Huron Iron works also protested in a general way against the improvement, and the hearing was adjourned for one week.

WANTS HIS CHILDREN.

Judge Egan will today hear the writ of habeas corpus sued out by Jane Mears, the grandmother of Lulu Mears, aged eleven years, and Essie Mears, aged two years, who are alleged to be the children of their liberty without authority of law by Edward McMurry. Some time since the parents of the children were divorced. The custody of the children was given to the mother by the court and that of the younger to the mother, who subsequently married McMurry, and lately died. Both children passed into the hands of McMurry. Mears, the father of the children, is out of the city, and the proceedings for their return were begun by their grandmother, who is acting upon the instruction of the father, the real person desiring their custody.

CARNEGIE WELL ROASTED.

The St. Paul Trades Assembly on the Home-Steal Outrage.

The trades and labor assembly met in regular fortnightly session last evening. The members took hold of the troubles at Home-Steal and, after an earnest discussion, appointed Cornelius Guiney, A. G. Jones and G. W. Deane a committee, which drafted the following resolutions, which were subsequently approved by a unanimous vote.

Whereas, the Carnegie Steel company, limited, have locked out their union employees, because they were unwilling to submit to a new contract which would reduce the wages of 60 per cent, according to the class of work.

Whereas, in an effort to carry out this purpose, they have employed the Pinkerton detective agency, and have caused the arrest of men who have ever been the tools of capital in its heartless and un-Christian actions, and who have stolen and wronged all times by the mandates of capital in the name of law, and who have been demonstrated in the history of labor troubles in the United States whenever this principle and an American organization has been called on to their assistance; and

Whereas, Andrew Carnegie has become many times a millionaire and has built a monumental estate in Scotland from the profits on the labor of his workmen, and has possessed the means in his philanthropic and has written many articles on the duties of employers and the responsibilities of wealth, and has advised the workers to organize and profit sharing; and

Whereas, the Carnegie company has not only forced this unjust reduction, but also declared its intention to employ "scab" labor, and to use any and every means to workmen the right to organize for protection, and to resist the use of the greatest monopolies in the United States; and

Whereas, we believe that any reduction of wages is entirely unwarranted, it being universally admitted that the profits of this company have been enormous and it also being conceded that the Carnegie company is amply able to support themselves and provide for their families; therefore,

Resolved, by the trades and labor assembly of St. Paul, that we condemn the action of this company in its effort to degrade labor, and hold it entirely responsible for the loss of life that has been occasioned by its importation of Pinkerton thugs without the sanction of law, and transfer a measure to the most sacred rights of the American citizen.

Resolved, That we sustain the men in the noble stand they have taken in defense of their families and homes, and offer every assistance in our power; and we hereby extend our hearty sympathy to the widows and orphans of the men who have sacrificed their lives in the cause of humanity against the oppression of poverty.

The assembly began preparations for celebrating labor day on the first Monday in September. The committees were named.
