

TROUBLE HATCHING.

A New Cause of Bad Feeling Discovered in Passenger Maneuvers.

Resentment Aroused by the Alleged Issue of a Milwaukee Circular.

Differential Lines Threaten War if Discrimination Is Proved.

Mr. White's Charges of Conspiracy Are Not Worrying Caldwell.

CHICAGO, July 30.—Passenger troubles seem to be multiplying. The latest cause for friction and ill-feeling among passenger men is the alleged discovery of a circular of instruction sent out by the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul road to its agents, naming certain Eastern lines as favored connections. An agreement entered into by a few Eastern and Western roads after the withdrawal of the Alton boycott, providing for an equitable division of business among them without the payment of commissions, was the cause of this circular being issued. It directed agents to route all through business originating at points on the St. Paul system equally over the Pennsylvania, Michigan Central and Lake Shore roads. The differential lines are naturally stirred up over this discovery. It means a loss of considerable business to the Chicago & Erie, the Wabash, the Baltimore & Ohio and the Chicago & Grand Trunk, especially if it should transpire that similar circulars have been issued by other Western roads that were parties to the agreement. These slighted lines are indignant, and threaten to adopt heroic measures to protect their interests if the discrimination is continued.

WHITE'S CHARGES.

Caldwell and Other Officials Are Not Worrying.

CHICAGO, July 30.—Chairman Caldwell, of the Western Passenger association, will wait until next week before selecting a man to act with E. A. Ford in arbitrating the differences between himself and the Atchison company. In the meantime he has nothing to say regarding the charge of conspiracy made against him and the members of his association by Passenger Traffic Manager White. Most of the officials of the roads included in the conspiracy charge are disposed to treat the matter lightly. If not with absolute merit, but in some instances it is plain to see that the levy is somewhat strained.

SCORES OF SPECIALS.

Cheap Rates to Denver Attracting Big Crowds.

CHICAGO, July 30.—Extensive preparations are being made by all the Western roads to carry the crowds that are sure to take advantage of the cheap rates to Denver and return on account of the Knights Templar convolve. Every passenger car that can be had will be put into service, and innumerable special trains will be kept the rails hot for several days between here and the Rocky mountains. Out of Chicago there will be thirty special trains run by the Rock Island, the Chicago & North Western, about thirty-five by the Alton, and at least a dozen by the Atchison, and an equal number by the Northwestern and Maple Leaf.

NEW FREIGHT RATES.

Change Not to Go Into Effect Until Aug. 15.

CHICAGO, July 30.—The new tariffs introduced by the Eastern roads changing the differential basis of freight rates as between Chicago and Boston on shipments from Chicago will not be put into effect until Aug. 15. This is a postponement from Aug. 1, the rates requiring further time for the revision of interior points. The change in the tariffs is made in compliance with an order issued some time ago by the interstate commerce commission.
