Mrs. L. P. Hunt, of Mankato, has the thing in charge, and proposes to advertise for designs. The competition is not limited to Minnesota artists, but is free to all modelers. The statue or group is to be life-size, and is to embody some scene from Longfellow's "Hiawatha," the only Indian legend which is exclusively and distinctly Minnesota.

The winning design will be the subject of a bronze group, and the artist within the limit of the plan, the competition is likely to be a very interesting one.
